

Understanding of the World

Travel on different types of transport e.g. train, bus, boat etc.
Buy a bus or train ticket.
Make a note of what you see on your journey to school.
Talk about road safety.
Discuss the basics of how a bicycle, scooter, car etc. moves.
Use remote control cars and programmable toys.
Go for a Spring walk and identify signs of Spring.
Plant some seeds in a pot or the garden.
Visit a farm during lambing season.
Look at the sky at night.

Expressive Art and Design

Make or use a moving model vehicle, e.g. paper aeroplane, helicopter, air rocket, balloon powered car.
Role play with toy cars, planes, trains.
Paint or draw a picture with as many different ways of travelling in it as possible.
Draw or paint pictures of the planets or make a 3D one!

Physical

Go for a walk and count the different types of transport you can see.
Go for a bike or scooter ride.
Learn some old playground games, e.g. What's the time Mr Wolf and hopscotch.
Use construction, beads or pegs to make vehicles and rockets.

Communication and Language

Learn songs, poems and rhymes about travelling, e.g. The Wheels on the Bus, Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star My Dad drives a Rusty Car etc.

Literacy


Read stories and poems about transport.
Write a list of all the different types of transport you saw on a journey.
Draw a picture of what you saw/can see out of a car/train/bus window and write a sentence/s as a caption.
Look at non-fiction books about Space.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Continue to encourage independence coming into school and taking care of own belongings.
Talk about road safety with your child.
Talk about feelings and read stories about characters who feel lonely or scared, e.g. Owl Babies by Martin Waddell.

Mathematics

Look at the numbers on houses when you are out walking. Notice how they get bigger or smaller as you travel along the road. Discuss odd and even door numbers.
Help your child to learn their left and right. Look at left and right turns when walking or driving anywhere.
Buy a ticket for a bus or train journey.
Play games that involve adding and taking away. Compare the amounts and use words including more/most/same/fewer/fewest.
