- Show your parents how independent you are when dressing and looking after your things
- Do something helpful around the house
- Play board games

- Share and read books at home
- Learn a poem off by heart
- Phoneme frames
- Sing Nursery rhymes
- Phone/Video call a relative and read them a story
- Practise letter formation

- Refer to school website, English zone for fine motor activity ideas
- Use chalk to write letters and words outside
- Write a letter to a family member
- Keep a diary
- Teach your family "Calm me time" and have sessions together
