

Easter Activities for Year 1 and Year 2

Write a message inside your Easter card. Can you spell all of your family names correctly and start all your letters in the right place?	Can you share what you have been doing with friends and family?	Draw out some egg outlines. Number the eggs. Get the grown up to hide them for you to find. Can you order the eggs in number order?	Jump around your garden like a rabbit (bunny hops).	Use construction materials to make an Easter basket.	Learn about why Christians celebrate Easter.	Do something kind for somebody in your family.
Write a letter to the Easter Bunny. Can you learn your address and write it on your letter so the Easter Bunny can find you?	Call a relative and read them a story.	Can you fill an egg shape with repeating patterns or 2D shapes?	Build a den – indoors or outside in the garden if the weather is good!	Make an Easter card for your family. You could try printing chick wings with your hands. There are lots of other ideas on 'Pinterest'.	Read a simplified Easter story.	Keep practising the correct way to wash hands. Can you remember when you should wash your hands and why it is important?
Easter egg word hunt. Hide Easter eggs with some of the words the children are learning in their spellings written on them. Can they find and read them? There could be a chocolate egg reward?!	Listen to stories about animals that lay eggs: The Ugly Duckling, The Little Red Hen, Rosie's Walk.	Number Gym Hold a number up for your child to read. Can they do that many star jumps, hops etc? Make it trickier by asking them to solve an addition or subtraction number sentence and show the answer by jumping or hopping that many times.	Continue to join in with Joe Wicks online PE lessons and Cosmic Yoga. Let us know if you discover anymore good online PE sessions.	Make an "Easter Tree" from a twig and decorate with brightly coloured Spring/Easter themed objects you have made or already have at home.	Find out how Easter is celebrated in other countries. What special food do people eat? Do they celebrate differently to us?	Play board games with your family. Can you take turns? Can you lose a game without getting upset? Can you say "well done" to the person that does win?
Easter egg hunt. Read clues to find your Easter eggs. Write clues for family members to find their eggs	Read a simple recipe to your child. Can they follow the instructions and cook something with you?	'Share' items out equally, e.g. share out 8 mini eggs equally between 2 people. How many mini eggs will they have each? And variations on this theme! Put socks in pairs when the washing has been done. Can you count the socks in 2s when you have finished...2,4,6,8,10?	If you have enough room, do garden circuits with different challenges set up at different points, e.g. bounce a ball 5 times, balance a ball on a racquet for 1 minute, do 10 star jumps etc.	Learn a new Easter song – Old MacDonald's Easter Farm, The Bunney Cokey or The Easter Bunny Song.	What can you find out about lifecycles? Frogs, butterflies, sheep etc. Draw or make a simple diagram of the lifecycle of a frog or butterfly. Visit The Woodland Trust website for some lovely activities to get closer to nature. The 'Tree Tools for Schools' has more games and resources to download.	Tidy up your toys and games yourself every day.
