
## **Poppy Appeal**

### **Time to Read**

Time sharing stories is time well spent. Children can benefit from reading in so many ways and there is no fixed way to do it! Reading as a family can be done anytime, anywhere with anyone. Reading together for just ten minutes a day improves children's imagination, language, emotional well-being and curiosity.

As part of Book Trust's annual Time to Read campaign Ash and Willow class received a free book.





### **Chestnut Class**

In Chestnut this half term we have been working on our topic: Walk on the Wild Side. Our learning has focused on looking at the features of different animals, which helps us decide how animals are similar and different from each other. We started our topic by reading Monkey Puzzle by Julia Donaldson, and the children acted out the parts in a role play session. We produced gorgeous collaged lions, painted camouflage animals that 'hid' very successfully, and created lift-the-flap books to reveal carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. Our class even had a 'virtual' visit from a tiger! The children have been very brave standing up in front of the class to talk about their favourite animals. It has been a wonderful start to Year I.

### **Silver Birch Class**

We began year one by learning all about each other. We made a lovely display showing all our portraits and completed booklets all about ourselves. The children learnt about parts of the body and about how important their senses are.

All the children have thoroughly enjoyed our topic called 'Walk on the Wild Side.' They have learnt about classifying animals into reptiles, amphibians, mammals, birds and fish. The children created some wonderful pictures illustrating camouflage and learnt why this is important for animals. They enjoyed talking about carnivores, omnivores and herbivores and how their teeth relate to what they eat.

During ICT, the children have completed work on early programming using 'Beebots' and some basic word processing skills. They impressed Mrs O'Neill with a performance of animal poems and were delighted to produce information books about Lions to give to the other classes as presents.

The children learnt about adjectives and wrote 'missing' posters to help Baby Monkey find his mummy.

Silver Birch have been working hard to respect one another and have made a display to remind them to use gentle hands.










# **Beech Class Book Recommendation**





As you are aware, we are planning to offer hot school lunches after half-term. In order for this to run as smoothly as possible, please can you help us with the following:


- Talk through the lunch menu with the children so they know what to expect.
