This half term our character focus is Holly.



Foundation Stage

The children have come back from the half term break happy and ready to start another busy half term. This half term our topic focus is 'People who Help us'. We will be learning about different occupations in our community and who we need to call on in an emergency. We started this week by reading the story 'You can't call an elephant in an emergency!'. Later this month we are looking forward to a visit from the local police team. If we have any parents who are nurses, doctors, vets, firefighters etc who would be willing to pop in to talk briefly about their job then please let us know. We would love to have you in.

<u>Year 1</u>

This Half Term, Year 1's topic is Walk on the Wild Side. Through talk, play, stories, poems, songs, art and writing, we will be learning to identify, name and describe a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals. We will discover which animals are carnivores, which are herbivores and which are omnivores. We will be walking around our beautiful school grounds to identify signs of autumn and will discuss the impact of seasonal change upon the plants and animals in our environment. We are looking forward to planting bulbs which will bring some gorgeous spring colour to our environment in the spring! Towards the end of term, we will begin to immerse ourselves in the magic and stories of Christmas.

Year 2

This half term, Year 2's topic is Remember Remember. Beech and Elm will be learning about the origins of Bonfire Night and the events that took place during the Gunpowder Plot. The children will be thinking about the sights, sounds and smells associated with watching a firework display and will use their ideas to write descriptive firework poems. Year 2 will also be learning about the importance of Remembrance and the significance of the red and purple poppies. They will use the red poppy in their Art lessons to create a range of work using drawing, paint and chalk. Many animals gave their lives in the war so children will be researching all about their roles during both World Wars and using their research to write a report. In PSHE, we will discuss celebrating difference and how treating each other with respect can make the world a better place. In Maths, we will be revising our number bonds to 10 and 20, looking at related number facts and using this knowledge to add and subtract from a 2-digit number. Another busy, but exciting, half term ahead!
