The <u>Winter Mini Challenge</u> is back, giving young readers the chance to earn prizes for finishing at least three books.

Organised by <u>The Reading Agency</u>, the challenge kicks off on Friday 1 December and runs until Monday 19 February. It will continue the 'Ready, Set, Read!' theme from the <u>Summer Reading Challenge</u>, which partnered with the <u>Youth Sport Trust</u> to keep minds and bodies active during the summer break.

This is a bitesize version of the main summer scheme, with children only needing to read three books instead of six. It is free, entirely online and children can unlock rewards as they progress, with lots of fun activities available on the dedicated children's website.

Once your child has finished a book, get them to add it to their <u>online profile</u>. Reaching their reading goal will allow them unlock a limited-edition virtual badge and a special Winter Mini Challenge certificate to print off and keep.

Children can access games, book reviews, activities and content from top children's authors and illustrators. For parents, there is also a <u>Home Zone</u> and <u>Library Zone</u>, which has more information and top tips.


