Foundation Stage

What another busy half term we have had! Our topic has been 'People who Help us' and we have been learning about different jobs in our local community. The children have shared ideas of what they would like to be when they grow up. We had a great visit from two PCSO's who talked about their jobs and even let some of the children try on different bits of uniform. The children enjoyed asking questions and learning about the police. In art we have painted pictures of people who help us, focusing on colours and the different

uniforms. We have shared lots of fun stories including 'You Can't Call an Elephant

in an Emergency'. The children have been applying their new phonic knowledge to read and write decodable words. There has been a focus on correct letter formation and their handwriting has shown great progress. The Christmas madness has recently hit and we have enjoyed learning the songs and dances for our Christmas play. The children did a fantastic job in their first performances.

The children have loved our new improvements to the outside area and we all can't wait to see what other resources are added to it in the coming months.



Year 1

As well as thinking about the changing seasons, Year 1 have been very busy learning about animals this half term. The children have been budding scientists – they have been thinking about how to group animals according to their different features or according to what they eat. You can see what the children have been learning in this half term's Knowledge Organisers on the Year 1 learning page of the website. Many of the children have used this new learning to add information to their favourite animal talks to the whole class. It's been wonderful to see how they have grown in confidence since the beginning of term.

In Design Technology we have been learning about simple levers and sliders. The children used these design features to make picture that included animals. There were killer whales that leapt from the sea or snakes that slithered through rainforests.

We have been focusing on the Julia Donaldson book *Monkey Puzzle* in literacy. We thought of ways to describe the mummy monkey character and enhanced our oracy skills by learning to retell the story to an audience of other Oaklands Infant School children.

Very recently, both classes have planted a mixture of bulbs at the front of the school as part of thinking about how we can contribute to the school grounds. We hope that in the spring there will be more flowers to bring a smile to everyone's faces.





<u>Year 2</u>

Year 2 have had another busy half term learning about the history behind calendar events marked during the months of November and December. As historians we discovered the reasons behind the Gunpowder Plot before looking at the significance of the poppy. We visited St John's Church and looked at the names of the brave soldiers from Crowthorne who gave their lives. You can see the key facts and information the children learnt on this half term's Knowledge Organisers on the Year 2 learning page of the website.



In Art, the children learnt about the artist Georgia O'Keefe and used her work as inspiration for some amazing pastel pictures of poppies.

In Literacy we have written poems, a non-chronological report and a story. Our focus has been on checking our sentence punctuation and trying to choose more ambitious vocabulary. We read the book 'Stubby' an incredible true story of Sergeant Stubby, the dog who served bravely in the First World War, sniffing out gas attacks, catching spies and winning the hearts of his fellow soldiers. This led us to do further research and write a report on other animals who helped during the war. We then moved on to the magical story of Alfie's star and wrote our own versions.

In Maths we have focussed on strategies for adding single digits before moving on to adding two digits add two digits, using the column method. Well done Elm and Beech for a great first term in Year 2!

Knowledge Organisers

The Autumn 2 knowledge organisers are available to you on the learning pages of the website. This is so you can clearly understand what your child has learnt this half term and a good way for you to review and revise their learning. Regular retrieval of knowledge helps us remember more effectively and helps the children have a deeper understanding over time.








Chestnut and Silver Birch Recommendations




