


Today, we say goodbye to Mrs Williams who is going on maternity. We wish her and her family well and we can't wait to meet the new addition.

At 8:50am the class doors will be shut and you will need to come through the school office, this is recorded as a late in the register.


Clothes Labelling

Foundation Stage



This term's topic is Snow & Ice and as if by magic the day we did our topic introduction it snowed! The children were very excited and enjoyed playing out in it trying to catch snowflakes on their hands and tongues. We will be investigating how to melt ice and how ice is made. We will also focus on animals from the two polar regions and how they are suited to living in such cold climates. Animals will be named and sorted by habitat. The book 'The Little Polar bear' will be shared and we will be doing some writing activities linked to the story. In Art we will be colour mixing primary colours to make secondary colours and using white paint to make cool colours. In

Maths we will be continuing to develop our subitising skills and looking at doubles.

Year 1

We are sure the children are going to love our Lower the Drawbridge topic this half term, which has both a history and geography focus. Earlier in the year, the children's history focused upon their own lives; this half term we will be thinking about the past and how it differs from the way we live now. The children will learn a little about William the Conqueror, King Harold, and the Battle of Hastings. We will think about how and why castles were built so differently to the houses we live in now. Midway through the topic, there is bound to be great excitement as all of Year 1 spend a day at Windsor Castle! This trip never fails to deliver the awe and wonder that will create memories and learning that last a lifetime.

As part of Geography, we will be looking at maps of the United Kingdom and learning the countries and capitals cities that are comprised within it and the seas that surround it. The children will begin to think about whether the features they see in the world around them are human features or physical features.

In science, we will be thinking more about the seasons, particularly how winter is different to autumn. Thinking like scientists, the children will regularly record the temperature and rainfall as well as noticing other changes over the coming term. This might vary from the clothes we wear outside, the time it gets light in the morning to the changes in the trees.

We are looking forward to watching the children learn and grow over this busy half term!

Year 2

On Thursday 11th January 2024, Year 2 packed their bags, had their passports stamped and boarded Oaklands Air on a flight to Kenya. After a safety briefing the flight took off and the children enjoyed some in-flight entertainment and a snack. Fortunately, it was a smooth flight, there was little turbulence and after a successful landing the children touched down in Nairobi to begin this half term's topic 'Home and Away'.





During this topic the children will compare life in Kenya to life in the UK. They will go on a 'safari ' and find out about the animals of Kenya and focus on writing a coherent, descriptive story opening based on the book 'Lila and the Secret of Rain'. They will end their topic with an African workshop, experiencing African dancing and drumming and Adinkra printing.





Once again we are going to be participating in this years NSPCC number day on **Friday 2**nd **February**. On this day the children are encouraged to come to school dressed as a digit/number and bring in a minimum donation of £1. The money raised will go directly to the NSPCC.

Dressing up ideas:

- * Dress up as a digit- Wear a onesie to represent 1, a tutu to represent 2, or a three piece suit to represent 3.
- * Dress up as a dice.
- Wear something with a number on it like a football kit
- Dress up as a playing card
- * Decorate an old t-shirt with numbers or number representations
- Dress up as a clock
- Dress up as a piece of Numicon

We are very aware that our venue in Crowthorne isn't accessible to everyone and in particular we know that there are many people in Sandhurst who would benefit from our olive branch support (including foodbank) closer to home.

We will be offering a welcoming environment with free refreshments (including very nice coffee) to anyone who fancies some company or a free drink. We just want to be there to meet the locals and build some relationships with the people of Sandhurst. If we can support people we will and this isn't exclusive to those in need of Food bank. We will also be bringing Food bank packs to anyone who needs essential food toiletries and cleaning items.
