Writing	Listen to the story of The Enormous Turnip read by Miss Weston: https://youtu.be/XnW2ZHQ1f6E Task - Change the ending of the story. Re-write the ending of the story from the part when they are pulling out the turnip. Explain that they couldn't get the turnip out. What do they do? Is there a new character? Is there any magic? Can you include ideas from other stories you have read? Can you include expanded noun phrases? Remember, once you have finished re-read and check your spellings.		Role-play Using the puppets from the story The Enormous Turnip create an alternative story. Could the characters pull out a different vegetable? For a friend or family member, can you record your performance of your story and send it to them.
