



# Home learning - Year 1 - Autumn Topic



Investigate different ways of making 10.

Go on a hunt around your house to find 2D (flat) shapes.

Practise writing numbers up to 20, remember which digit comes first with those bigger numbers!

Count how many evergreen trees you see on your way to school. The next day, count the trees that are deciduous (turning brown), which were there more of, which was the greater number?

Read fiction and non-fiction books with links to the seasons, trees or animals that hibernate. If the book has a contents page practise using it.

Have you heard any fireworks this year? Write a list of words to describe the different sounds fireworks make. You could even turn them into a poem!

Practise your spelling list.

Go for a walk and see how many signs of autumn you can spot.

Collect some autumn items (leaves, acorn cups etc.) and create a collaged picture.

Notice what time it gets dark each day, is it dark when you are having dinner or when you are going to bed?

Take responsibility for your own books bag - giving notes to adults at home and at school.

Check that your clothes are named.

Learn to do your own buttons and to turn your clothes back to normal when they are inside out.
