
We would love you to continue reading with your child over the half term, you could visit your local library to borrow a range of books, ask a different family member to read to your child or complete the reading bingo below.


Please find attached to the newsletter an autumn reading bingo that your children might like to participate in to keep reading fun during the half term.


Marvellous Maths




Welcome to our monthly Maths section of the newsletter. Each month we would like to share with you an overview of what the children have been learning in school, introduce some of the models and resources we use during Maths lessons along with a Maths challenge and share our Mathematician of the half term.

What we have been learning this half term - Autumn I

Foundation Stage – counting, subitising (recognising numbers), comparing numbers, understanding one more and one less, talking about





2D and 3D shapes, creating and extending ABAB patterns


Year I – reading and writing numbers to 20, counting forwards and backwards, place value of numbers to 10, introducing part whole model


Year 2 – reading and writing numbers to 100, counting forwards and backwards from any start number, place value of numbers to 100, using part whole model.


Find out about place value in this useful video Maths with Michael | White Rose Maths and read a useful parent guide on the school website.

What is the part whole model?

The part whole model is a pictorial representation that shows the relationship between a whole and its parts. They are introduced during Reception and used in the mastery approach. Children using this model will see the relationship between the whole number and its component parts, helping learners to make the connections It works on the principle that if you know two values out of three, you can calculate the missing value. Part-part-whole reasoning also helps students to interpret, visualize, and solve word problems. By breaking down numbers into smaller chunks, they can learn how numeracy relates to other maths skills, including addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division.







Mathematician of the half term: - Autumn 2

Katherine Johnson 1918 - 2020



Next half term we will be introducing our first Mathematician of the year. Katherine Johnson was an American mathematician. She made important contributions to the United States space program during her career at the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA). Her work helped send astronauts to the Moon. She was known for solving complicated calculations

and helped the space agency to pioneer the use of computers to perform tasks.

A shop keeper counting out a person's change.


An architect drawing a design for a building.
