Dear Parents/Carers,



It's British Science Week!



British Science Week is a ten-day celebration of science, that runs from the 11th to the 20th March. It's time to celebrate all things science!

The focus for 2022 is **GROWTH**. Growth is part of our everyday lives, it affects people, plants and animals! Growth can also include the growth of buildings and having a 'growth mindset'



What is Science?

Science is learning about all the things around us. Scientists find answers to questions such as,

- * Why is the sky blue?
- * What is the biggest animal?
- * Will we ever run out of water?
- * What is a star?



Here are some ideas for growth activities you could try at home to celebrate British Science Week:

- Share the story of Jack and the Beanstalk, think about the growth of the bean into a beanstalk. Using the story, talk about how the beanstalk began as a small bean and then grew taller and taller. Why not grow your own beanstalk, you could even add Jack and the Beanstalk character cut- outs for extrafun!
- Think about your own growth and how people change as they grow. How have you changed since you were born?
- Explore a range of seeds using a magnifying glass and talk about their different sizes and shapes.
- Think about the growth of buildings. Be like Ivy and challenge yourself to build a tall building using cardboard boxes, cardboard tubes and masking tape. How tall can you make your building? How can you make it strong and stable?
- Why not go on a tree hunt walk in your local area? How many different types of trees can the you spot? Look carefully at the different types of leaves and bark on the trees. Are the trees all the same height? Which trees do you think have been growing for a long time?
- Take photos when you are out and about of things that grow and create an 'I spy' game with them at home.
- Go on a walk to find natural items that link with growth, twigs, leaves, seeds etc. Use a magnifying glass to look closely at them remember not to put anything in your mouth and wash your hands afterwards!
- Science is such a big part of our daily lives. You could have a think about some questions that interest you and try to find the answers to them with the help of an adult.
