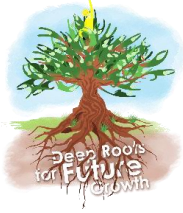

## Induction Days

Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> July 9.30 – 10.30am with parent presentation at 9.45am

Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> July – 9.30-10.45am

Drop Off: from 9.30-9.40am on the first induction day to give you some time to settle your child into the class before the presentation at 9.45am.

Clothing: comfortable clothing is fine. No uniform is required for the induction days.

Pick Up: Please collect at the end of the session from the external classroom door.

You will be able to indicate which date is best for you on the enrolment form and we will then allocate a twenty-minute appointment for you and your child to come into school and meet the teacher.

**Phased school start**

Wednesday 7th September – either a morning or an afternoon

Thursday 8th September – either a morning or an afternoon.

Friday 9th September – children start full time

There will be a phased introduction to school, allowing your child to experience a morning and an afternoon on two consecutive days, before starting school full time. This enables staff to give the children more individual attention, which is very beneficial, getting them used to being in school gradually.
