Wokingham Children's Book Festival

There is just under a month to go until the return of the <u>Wokingham Children's Book Festival</u> and we can't wait to welcome lots of brilliant authors to town. The festival is being held on the weekend of 14th and 15th October and many of the 13 events are already proving to be popular.

This year's <u>line-up</u> includes Nick Sharratt, Holly Webb, Iszi Lawrence Jane Elson and Clare Bevan. Each workshop is followed by a book signing and sessions are always interactive and family-friendly.

Children can meet their favourite authors, learn more about the creative process of coming up with characters and have a go themselves by taking part in drawing activities.

Tickets remain priced at £3 per person and can be purchased from the <u>Wokingham Children's Book Festival</u> <u>website</u>.

Reading Guardians

We are looking forward to welcoming volunteers into school to support with reading. We are going to take a slightly different approach this year and have a team of 'Reading Guardians' made up of parents, carers and volunteers who go into class to listen to children read 1:1. This year we would like all volunteers to take part in a short training session where we will go through the best ways to support children when hearing them read 1:1 and to share with you the key principles behind our phonics scheme 'Sounds-Write', to ensure we have a consistent approach to teaching children how to read.

Each 'Reading Guardian' will be assigned a class to read with for the term. This will ensure each class has a similar number of volunteers visiting over the week. If you volunteer to become a Reading Guardian you will not be always guaranteed to be in your child's class as you will be visiting different classes over the year.

The training will take place on **Thursday 28th September**, following drop off. At 8:50 we will meet in the Year 2 library. Please let the school office know if you would like to attend the training on this date.



In recent years the internet has become an integral part of our children's lives and it can be hard for parents to keep up with developments and to know the best way to keep their child safe online.

In school, we deliver a planned, progressive e-safety curriculum and key messages appropriate to your child's age.

We are using Project Evolve, a tool kit that provides opportunities for discussion; prompted by appropriate questions accompanied by honest and useful information to shape thinking and challenge misconceptions.

This term the theme is: Self Image and Identity

What we will cover

I can recognise that anyone can say 'no' - 'please stop' - 'I will tell' - 'I will ask' - to somebody who makes them feel sad, uncomfortable or upset.

If something happens that makes me feel sad, uncomfortable, frightened or worried, I can give

examples of when and how to speak to an adult I can trust and how they can help.

I can explain how other people may look and act differently online and offline.

I can give examples of issues that might make someone feel sad, worried, frightened or

uncomfortable; I can give examples of how they might get help.

Below are a selection of questions we will be asking the children:

Who can help you if something ever worries or upsets you?

How can you ask for help? What would you say?

What are the different ways you can tell someone 'no'?





Attendance matters!




Did you know?.....

Two school days missed each month during your school life, adds up to one whole year of school lost. 90% attendance may seem high but that adds up to approximately 19 days of absence each academic year Pupils with 90% attendance or less are considered persistent absentees. These figures are reported to the local authority on a termly basis.

Daily lateness equates to.... 5 minutes late = 3 days lost learning 10 minutes late = 6 days lost learning 15 minutes late = 10 days lost learning Miss School Miss Out!

Taking an unauthorised holiday is a criminal offence and may result in either a fixed penalty notice or prosecution.

5 consecutive or individual days of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period will be referred to Education Welfare to issue a fixed penalty notice. This is equal to £60 per parent per child.
