

A Parent's Guide to Cyberbullying











Ramadan 2024

In 2024 Ramadan begins on March 10th plus or minus a day, dependent on the moon sighting. Eid-ul-Fitr (the festival marking the end of Ramadan) falls on 9th April (plus or minus a day).

Muslim school staff and pupils will be marking this holy month in the Islamic calendar by fasting between dawn and sunset each day, in order to devote themselves to their faith, show what life is like for those less fortunate and show self-discipline.

Once Ramadan is finished, Muslims will celebrate Eid ul-Fitr, the Festival of the Breaking of the Fast, spending time with family, friends, loved ones and the local community, who come together to rejoice, enjoy good food and exchange gifts.

Funding to help your child and the school

Schools get extra funding, known as the 'Pupil Premium', for every child registered as eligible for a free school meal if their parents are receiving benefits.

Schools use this money for activities such as art therapy, booster classes, educational trips, and after-school clubs.

To qualify, your child must be in school and you must be receiving one of the following benefits:

Income support

Income based <u>Job Seekers Allowance</u>
Income related Employment and Support Allowance

NASS support

Guarantee element of **State Pension**



<u>Child Tax Credit</u>, provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190

Working Tax Credit for the four weeks after employment ends

Universal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400

If this applies to you but your child isn't registered for free school meals, complete a form and return it to your child school.

Download the form and apply for Free School Meals on Wokingham Borough Council's website.
