Go red from head to toe or simply dig out your brightest socks. Wear something that makes you and your school smile. Wearing something


red could just be a red nose and we kindly ask that anyone with a bought red nose, keeps it safe when not being worn i.e. in a pocket or school bag.



Foundation Stage



This half term our topic is Adventure Time! The half term started with much excitement when some funny sandy footprints were discovered in Ash and Willow classrooms. After lots of investigating we found that they belonged to a Parasaurolophus. This started our focus on dinosaurs and we will be learning about all different types of dinosaurs. Some of the children are experts so we're sure they will be teaching the teachers a few things. We

will be learning about how dinosaurs defended themselves, what they liked to eat and how we can learn a lot from fossils. We will be reading

'Harry and his bucket of dinosaurs' and deciding where we would like to take our dinosaurs on an adventure. We will then be leaving the prehistoric times and will be going on an adventure to space and learning about our solar system. In Maths we will become more familiar with the counting pattern beyond 20, explore the composition of numbers within 10, look at odd and even numbers and begin to link even numbers to doubles. It's going to be another busy, fun and crazy half term in Ash and Willow!



Year 1

This half term Year 1 are travelling 'Far Far Away' in our Geography based topic. We will be using maps and globes to name and locate the 7 continents of the world and using directional language including near and far, left and right. We have heard about where children went during half term both locally and much further afield as they develop their oracy skills in speaking in full sentences. The Magic Bed by John Burningham is our writing inspiration, ask your child to retell the story. Where would you go in a magical adventure? In Science we continue to consider the seasons as we move from winter to spring. Throwing, catching and aiming are the areas we will be working in our outside PE, we are 'rocking and rolling' in our gym lessons.



Year 2

This term Year 2 will be learning all about how to stay healthy as part of their PSHE and Science curriculum. The children will learn about what makes healthy lifestyle including a balanced diet, the importance of exercise and rest. In the weeks to follow we will be learning all about personal hygiene, safe and unsafe medicine and how to look after our mental health. To stay



all about personal hygiene, safe and unsafe medicine and how to look after our mental health. To start off our 'Healthy Me' topic, the children visited Pizza Express to find out how to make pizzas and the children were fortunate enough to make and eat their own pizza!


In English, our focus text will be 'The Light House Keepers Lunch'. We will use this text to write instructions and write our own version of the story. Grammar, punctuation and joining our handwriting will also continue to be a focus. In Maths, the children will be learning all about division and multiplication and will be focusing on their 2s, 5s and 10-time tables. Across the Foundation Subjects, Year 2 will be painting seascapes in the style of Turner, asking and answering questions using pictograms and graphs in Computing and learning about the physical and human features of the seaside in Geography. A fun packed half term ahead!

It's British Science Week!




British Science Week is a ten-day celebration of Science, that runs from the 7th to the 16th March. It's time to celebrate all things science!


