

Home learning - Year 1 – All About Us



Numeracy

- Count how many people in your family or how many friends you see on your way to school.
- Sort your toys into different groups. For example, all the animals in one group, all the cars in another.
- Run a race with your family; can you say who came first, second, third and so on?
- Count forwards to 10 and backwards to 0.
- Practise writing numbers 1 to 10 in numerals and words.

Literacy

- Ask someone to read you poems or stories about families.
- Find non-fiction books at the library.
- Write your name, including your surname, with the correct use of upper- and lower-case letters.
- Think about people that are special and important to you. Draw or take a picture of them and write a sentence for each explaining why they are special.

Cross Curricular

- Ask your grandparents about what school was like when they were five or six.
- Walk with an adult around Crowthorne and talk about what has changed since they have lived here.
- Make a face or body from playdough – can you name the parts e.g. legs, shoulders, eyes, nose etc?
- Look at a photograph of your family members and notice how they have changed over the years.
- Talk about what you did last year. Did you go away on holiday? Where and how did you celebrate Christmas?
- Make an all about me collage. You might include pictures of family, favourite places, tickets from a special trip or a menu from your favourite restaurant.

Goldie

- Say 'thank you' after every meal.
- Can you tell your adults something that is special about them?
- Play a turn taking game with your brother, sister or other family member.
- Help to tidy your bedroom.
- Remember to say 'please' whenever you ask for something.
