Positive Reinforcement



Every Monday, two children from each class, who have shown behaviour linked with the current 'focus' character, will be awarded a 'leaf' by Miss Weston during assembly and will have 'tea' with her later in the week.



Each week a child will be chosen at random to be our star of the week. All week any of the children can write or draw anything positive about the 'Star of the Week'.



The children can individually or as a class earn marbles for making positive choices in their learning and behaviours. Once the marble jar is full, the class vote for their reward e.g. bring a teddy to school, extra playtime etc.



Each week, one class wins the Class of the Week trophy

The Oaklands Way Circle

 All children will start each session with their name in the centre circle.



- If a child does not meet expectations, they will be given a verbal warning.
- If they continue, their name will be moved to the next circle out from the centre. This is accompanied with an explanation and reminders of how they can get their name back into the centre.
- If the behaviour is repeated, they will receive a consequence e.g. moving to a different table to work, time out in a different class or missing a few minutes of a break.
- All children will be placed back in the centre at the beginning of each session.



Casey's Crew

- Children in Year 2 can apply to be a member of Casey's Crew to help look after others on the playground during lunchtimes and playtimes.
- Children complete an application form
- Training and regular check ins
- Applications will come home tomorrow to be returned by Friday 26th. If your child is interested, please take time to talk about making a commitment and taking a real pride in completing their application.
- We also vote for two children to be our school council representatives.

We spend a lot of time teaching the skills of reading and listening to the children read.

- Regular phonics sessions
- Tapping in Reading / Guided Reading (in a group)
- One to one reading with an adult

In Year 2, there is a strong focus on comprehension skills as well as phonics skills.

- 1. Letters are symbols that represent sounds.
- 2. A sound may be spelled by 1, 2, 3 or 4 letters.

3. The same sound can be spelled in more than one way.

4. Many spellings can represent more than one sound.

Home Reading

- Books are changed on Mondays.
- The children choose two colour banded books and they are given one decodable book.
- <u>Lots</u> of home reading please, we can teach the skills but regular practice is essential.
- Please record if they have read with you a signature is fine.
- 4 or 5 short sessions of 3 or 4 pages are better than one long 'got to read the whole book' session.
- It's important to have a relaxed, enjoyable read at home.



Why read 20 minutes at home?			
Child A Reads	Child B Reads	Child C Reads	
20 minutes a day	5 minutes a day	1 minute a day	
3600 minutes per school year	900 minutes per school year	180 minutes per school year	
1,000,000 words per year	282,000 words per year	8000 words per year	

If a child starts reading for 20 minutes a day per night in Reception, by the end of Year 6 Child A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, Child B will have read for 12 days and Child C will have read for 3.

Want to be a better reader? Simply read!

10 Minutes reading to someone 10 minutes sharing or being read to = 20 minutes An example of a child working at the 'expected' level in Spring Term of Year 2.



Please encourage your child to use the correct pencil grip. It will make writing a much more comfortable experience in the long run. It is hard to remedy as they get older.


Spelling

- Taught in phonics
- Taught as part of English lessons
- There will be an assessment on some of the Year 2 words at the end of each half term and to see if they apply them within dictated sentences.

<u>Maths</u>

- We use a maths mastery approach.
- Underlying number knowledge is key, we do not just carry out lists of calculations as this does not build deep understanding.
- Maths is not all about numbers —
 e.g. days of the week and shape




Key Maths Facts

Then we will assess the children at the end of each half term.


The assessments will be sent home so that you can support your child in the areas they found tricky.




Home Learning
