What are knowledge organisers?


Knowledge organisers are a summary of the key facts and essential knowledge that pupils need about a unit of work or a curriculum subject.

Each year group has developed knowledge organisers containing key vocabulary and knowledge along with visual prompts.

The Autumn 1 knowledge organisers are available on the learning pages of the website. This is so you can clearly understand what your child has learnt this half term and a good way for you to review and revise their learning. Regular retrieval of knowledge helps us remember more effectively and helps the children have a deeper understanding over time.










Autumn is well and truly here!


