

Foundation Stage

Our half term started with the topic, 'People who help us.' We learnt about many different job roles in our community. The children had some great ideas about what they would like to do when they are grown-ups. We were fortunate enough to have visits from both the police and the fire brigade! Both classes have been working hard in phonics and have begun to write simple sentences with some support. We have been amazed at their have a go attitude and the progress they are making. The last few weeks have consisted of a lot of Christmas fun including two plays, a carol concert at the church, a visit to the pantomime, Christmas lunch, parties and lots of Christmas crafts. The children are very excited about Santa's imminent arrival and are looking forward to a rest over the break after what has been a very hectic half term!



Year 1

This half term our topic has been Walk on the Wild Side. The children have enjoyed learning about different animal groups in science and shared their knowledge through the talks they have given to their class about an animal. In DT, we created sliders so that an animal could move stealthily through the jungle. It is great to hear that some children also had a go at home.

Year 2


Year 2 have had another busy half term learning about the history behind calendar events marked during the months of November and December. As historians we discovered the reasons behind the Gunpowder Plot before looking at the significance of the poppy. We visited St John's Church and looked at the names of the brave soldiers from Crowthorne who gave their lives. You can see the key facts and information the children learnt in this half term's Knowledge Organisers on the Year 2 learning page of the website.

In Art, the children have used watercolours and pastels to create some amazing pictures of poppies. We learnt about the artist Georgia O'Keefe and used her work as inspiration for close up images.

In Literacy we have continued with our Clever Writer Key Skills. We have written a diary entry and a character description based upon two brilliant texts, *Vlad and the Great Fire of London* and *The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark*. In Maths, we have started looking at strategies for addition and subtraction. Year 2 have also been super Scientists, investigating the most suitable material for making Nanna's sock! Well done Elm and Beech for a great first term in Year 2!




Value Awards

Little Musketeers at Oaklands Infant School | Red Term – Resilience

Little Musketeers are back offering a fun, safe and educational environment for young children to learn the sport of fencing. What child has not grown up pretending to be a swashbuckling pirate, a duelling Musketeer, or even the master of swordplay himself, Zorro? Why do they do it? Because it's fun!

Little Musketeers provide bright coloured foam and plastic foils and plastic masks with mesh visors that are safe and yet hard enough to give children the real feel of fencing. We ensure visors are worn at all times giving peace of mind as well as that genuine fencing experience.

Little Musketeers classes are designed and managed by Olympic fencer and 4 times British National Champion James Beavers. All staff are CRB checked, First Aid certified and trained personally by James.

This term's course will focus on building your child's resilience, as well as developing their timing and spatial awareness. Once the course is completed, they will be awarded with the Red term wristband.

We hope you can join us for our 10-week course, held at Oaklands Infant School as follows:

- Wednesday 14th January - Wednesday 25th March 2026 / 07:45 - 08:40 / Reception, Year 1, Year 2, Year 3, Year 4

The cost for the course will be £80.00 per child.
