We would like to warmly welcome all our Infant children and families back after the Christmas holidays. We hope you all had a restful and enjoyable break.

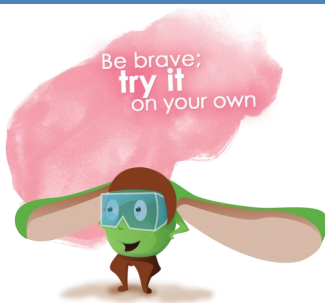

Foundation Stage

We are excited to start the Spring term by learning about our amazing planet and its Polar Regions! We will be exploring the unique animals that live in these icy habitats and discovering how they survive in such extreme conditions. We will learn lots of fascinating facts about polar animals and think about how their habitats differ from other places on Earth. In Drawing Club, we will explore a range of polar-themed books to inspire our creativity and mark making. The children will have the chance to bring these chilly worlds to life through their drawings and magic word and number codes. There will be plenty of opportunities for hands-on activities, discussions, and creativity to make learning fun and memorable. It's going to be an exciting half term full of exploration and imagination!



Year 1

We are sure the children are going to love our Lower the Drawbridge topic this half term, which has both a History and Geography focus. Earlier in the year, the children's history focused upon their own lives; this half term we will be thinking about the past and how it differs from the way we live now. The children will learn a little about William the Conqueror, King Harold, and the Battle of Hastings. We will think about how and why castles were built so differently to the houses we live in now. We will also spend a day at Windsor Castle! This trip never fails to deliver the awe and wonder that will create memories and learning that last a lifetime.



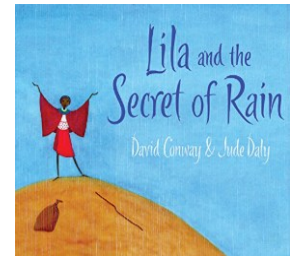
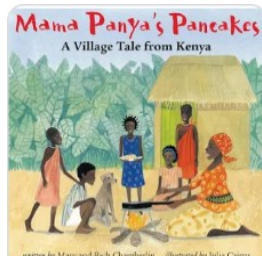
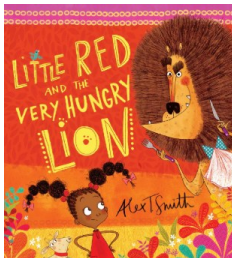
As part of Geography, we will be looking at maps of the United Kingdom and learning the countries and capitals cities that are comprised within it and the seas that surround it. The children will begin to think about whether the features they see in the world around them are human features or physical features.

In Science, we will be thinking more about the seasons, particularly how winter is different to autumn. Thinking like scientists, the children will regularly record the temperature and rainfall and check our Oaklands weather station <https://app.weathercloud.net/d9878357425> as well as noticing other changes over the coming term. This might vary from the clothes we wear outside, the time it gets light in the morning to the changes in the trees.



On Monday 12th January, Year 2 left behind the grey, cold weather of England, packed their bags, had their passports stamped and boarded Oaklands Air on a flight to Nairobi, Kenya. After a safety briefing the flight took off and the children enjoyed some inflight entertainment and a snack. Fortunately, it was a smooth flight, there was little turbulence and after a successful landing the children touched down in Nairobi to begin this half term's topic Home and Away.

In English, our focus will be on adding detail to sentences through description and use of conjunctions such as **because**, **when** and **if**. You can see our Clever Writer texts for this half term pictured below.



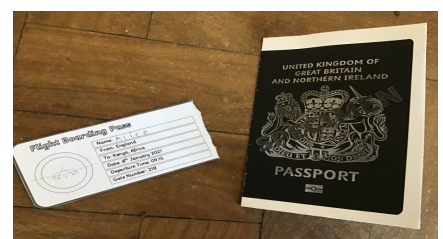
This is a Geography led topic so we will be finding out about the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator and the North and South Poles.

In Maths, we will be looking at more formal written methods to solve addition and subtraction calculations as well as learning about measuring length and height.

Our Science learning this half term focuses on finding about the basic needs of animals including humans for survival.

In Art, we will be learning about the importance of masks in African culture, the children will design their own mask using cardboard relief to bring it to life.

The topic will end with an exciting African workshop, where we will have an opportunity to take part in African dancing and drumming. An exciting half term ahead!

Reading at Home

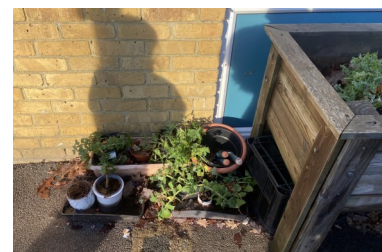
The children discussed the importance of reading and shared ideas on how we can encourage more reading at home.
